Summary Analysis of CPCE Data: All but one CPCE subscale score and the total score were higher than the national mean. Additionally, scores on more than one subscale are up from recent years. The Social/Cultural score was slightly below the national mean with a .15 (2.6%) below. While this is a slightly lower score than previous CPCE scores on this subscale, we recognize that the pandemic could be a factor (e.g., lower graduation rate). We will continue to monitor scores on this subscale and provide support to students in this area. Due the pandemic, study sessions were not held for the CPCE spring 2021. We will resume these study sessions in 2022.

Summary of Results

Analysis of KPI Assignments: All KPI assignments met the benchmark of at least 80% of students meeting or exceeding outcome measurement. During a global pandemic, this is excellent news. We will stay the course and continue improving and fine-tuning our courses.

Analysis of CPCE Data: All CPCE subscale mean scores were passing scores, with meets the benchmark. We will continue to monitor scores on all subscales and provide support to students, including study sessions. **Analysis of PPC Data:** All PPC outcomes met the benchmark of at least 80% "meeting expectations." Again, in a year that saw our students impacted by COVID-19, this is great. We will continue to attune to student needs and assess their dispositions.

Analysis of Program Objectives overall: Given the difficult year for everyone during the COVID-19 global pandemic, the students worked hard with faculty support. This is evident in passing benchmarks for all but one CP each program objective. Faculty will continue to work to improve the program, including the recent addition of courses that help the students meet licensure needs in the state of Nevada.




In a survey sent out to employers of CED graduates, we gained valuable information. We had a 43.75% response rate.


Do you consider the fact that a candidate completed his/her training and licensure with the College of Education?




Compared to graduates of other universities, graduates from the UNLV College of Education Counseling Program are:




What is your overall rating of the job performance of UNLV College of Education Counseling Program graduates?




What is your overall rating of the quality of UNLV College of Education Counseling program in preparing well-qualified education professionals?

Please indicate to what extent you agree with the following statements about the graduates of the College of Education Counseling program (School Counseling, Clinical Mental).




Analysis of Survey Results: Overall, employers of CED graduates found them to prepared with good job performance in a variety of objective areas. This is great news! **Program modifications based on data**: None.

Site Supervisor Rating of Intern Survey

At the end of the academic term, each site supervisor rates her/his supervisee (practicum/internship student) on 22 items intended to measure competency and professional skill. Across the 22 items Site Supervisors rated CED Students on a scale from 1 - 5 (1=Clearly Deficient, 5=Clearly Excellent). The two lowest rated items and two highest rated items are in the graph below.





Analysis of Survey Results: Site Supervisors rated CED Students (on average) lowest on the items "Knows Legal Rights of Clients" and "Knows Legal Aspects of Counseling" at 4.36 each. The two highest rated items were "Behaves ethically and responsibly with clients, colleagues and adjunct agencies" at 4.8 and "Responsibly schedules and meets with clients" at 4.78. The CPCE scores point to professional orientation/ethics as an area of strength for CED students. However, a review of CED 743 for potential changes in curriculum or altering the instructional design toward greater emphasis on the legal aspects of counseling including the legal rights of clients is warranted. **Program modifications based on data**: None.
