AN ACT TO REALLOCATE FUNDS FOR HABESHA STUDENT ASSOCIATION

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Students of the University of Nevada Las Vegas (CSUN) represents all 25,000+ undergraduate students enrolled at the University of Nevada Las Vegas; and

WHEREAS, the Senate of the Consolidated Students of the University of Nevada Las Vegas, under the authority of CSUN Constitution VI..D.01, is “empowered to enact any legislation that falls under the jurisdiction of CSUN”; **AND**

WHEREAS, CSUN must actively advocate for the needs of undergraduate student organizations; **AND**

WHEREAS, the student organization has completed all of the necessary documentation as required by the Ways and Means Committee and the Ways and Means Operating Policy; **AND**

WHEREAS, the Habesha Student Association provided a Reallocation budget under *Addendum A*; **AND**

WHEREAS, the CSUN Ways and Means Committee will review the request to reallocate funds on April 16, 2024, during WM 54-11 **AND**

WHEREAS, the CSUN Ways and Means Committee allocated funds previously for the \$3522.07 on February 05, 2024 for Senate Meeting 54-08 in Senate Bill 54-29 Under *Addendum A*; **AND**

WHEREAS, the student organization, after being seen by the Ways and Means Committee, having been approved for reallocation of their original approved budget;**AND**

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED, CSUN shall amend Senate Bill 54-29 to authorize Habesha Student Association to reallocate funds in adherence with the Ways and Means Operating Policy for CSUN FY24
