# UNLV World Languages and Cultures Syllabus for Chinese 114 (Elementary Chinese II)

# **Course Description:**

CHI 114 is a 3 credit hours' online course in Elementary Mandarin Chinese. This course (Lesson 6 - Lesson 10) is the continuation of Elementary Chinese I (CHI 113) and designed to reinforce and further develop language skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing as it relates to everyday life situations. It will take approximately 4 sessions to complete one lesson. There will be 5 quizzes, 6 assignments, 2 oral presentations, a 75-minute midterm, and a 2-hour final exam.

## **Learning Objectives:**

Students who have completed the second semester of Elementary Chinese (CHI 114) are expected to be able to

- Comprehend simple dialogues and passages read or spoken by Chinese natives at normal speed with familiar vocabulary.
- Discuss orally topics of general interest and daily routines (e.g., making appointments, describing school life, shopping, commenting about means of transportation, etc.).
- Comprehend short written dialogues and reading passages with familiar vocabulary.
- Master Chinese phonetic symbols (pinyin), apply the principles (e.g., stroke orders, basic radicals, etc.) of writing Chinese characters, and write longer sentences.

#### **Attendance and Class Participation:**

Attendance in this class is vital; therefore, unexcused absences negatively affect the final grade. Each unexcused absence drops one point from your final grade. Excessive tardiness or leaving early will also have a negative impact on a student's grade. Since late arrivals are disruptive, please make every effort to arrive a few minutes early. In contrast, students who have no excused and unexcused absences will obtain THREE points as extra credits to their final grades; students who have only one excused and no unexcused absences will obtain TWO points as extra credits to their final grades; and students who have only two excused and no unexcused absences will obtain One point as an extra credit to their final grades. Appropriate documentations are accepted for excused absences. Absences and lack of enthusiasm for classroom participation will impact the final grade.

Class participation is required of all students. Class participation is defined as students being randomly called upon by the instructor and providing an answer that shows the student has read the

assigned material. Class disruption or sleeping during class will have a negative impact on a student's grade. Class disruption includes, but is not limited to, speaking while the instructor or another student is talking, cellular telephones ringing during class, and answering cellular telephones during class.

#### **Oral Presentations:**

- One-on-one Interview: students will be interviewed by instructor individually. Time for the interview is 3-5 minutes per student.
- Group Oral Presentation: this presentation is a group project of two or three students. The topic of the presentation will be chosen and decided by each group, and each student needs to speak at least 10 commonly used grammars/expressions that learned from Lesson 6 to Lesson 10 in the script. The script needs be typed and turned in two weeks before scheduled presentation time. Discussing the script with the instructor is required before the oral presentation. Time for the oral presentation is 8-10 minutes per group.

## **Assignments:**

Homework will be assigned and graded. Assignments must be completed and prepared well for the chapter quizzes. Late homework will be NOT accepted unless there is an acceptable reason.

## **Quizzes and Examinations:**

- Quizzes will be given to test your use of new words and sentence patterns.
- A mid-term examination and a final examination will be given during the semester. Students are expected to be on time for exams.
- Quizzes may be made up only for an acceptable reason. Mid-term and the Final examinations cannot be made up for any reason. As a rule, a student missing a class because of observance of a religious holiday shall have the opportunity to make up the missed work.

- Quizzes 20% (4+4+4+4+4=20)
- Oral Presentations 10% (5 + 5 = 10)
- Mid-term Examination 10%
