Graduate Program Goals After completing my undergraduate degree, I plan to pursue an MBA and possibly a Master of Science in Accounting.






Jevaughn Caesar Aldana




Linda Carrera

Marcella Johnson








JESSI CA PI ERRETTE

In the long term I wish to help people with neurocognitive disorders, understand the brain, and contribute to the field to a great extent






Melanie Solorio




Nathaniel Valentine
