MBA PROGRAM ADMISSION INFORMATION

Students may pursue the evening MBA program only or pursue one of the dual programs. The available dual programs are dual MBA/JD (Juris Doctorate), dual MBA/DDM (Dental Medicine), dual MBA/MS HOA (Hotel Administration), and dual MBA /MS MIS (Management Information Systems). Requirements

Applicants are expected to demonstrate strong written and verbal communication skills, computer proficiency and quantitative skills. All aspects of your application, including the fulfillment of these requirements, are subject to verification. Post-undergraduate professional experience is not required for admission to the MBA program; however, it is recommended. The equivalent of a four-year U.S. bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in any field of study is required. A business undergraduate degree is not required.

□ Transcripts

Transcripts are required for all undergraduate and graduate-level institutions attended. Unofficial transcripts may be uploaded in the online application. Official copies of transcripts from all colleges and universities attended must be sent to the MBA Programs office at the following address. □ Statement of Intent

The statement of intent is required and must be uploaded to your online application. It should be two pages in length, double spaced, and a font size of 12. The statement should address how an MBA education experience will assist you in meeting your professional career goals. This should include a description of the leadership or managerial attributes you will bring to the program.

□ Letters of Recommendation

Two letters of recommendation, academic or professional, are required. Designate your recommenders in your online application profile. Recommenders will receive an e-mail that will let them know you have requested a letter and instructions on how to upload the letter into the application system.

□ Resume

A resume or curriculum vitae (CV) must be uploaded to your online application. Outline your work experience and include the company name, job title, and detailed information about your responsibilities for each position.







□ Graduate Management Admissions Test

All applicants are required to take the Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT). We also accept the GRE exam. The GMAT test is offered year-round and can be taken multiple times. Scores are valid for five years. If you have taken the test more than once, the admissions committee will use your highest total score to evaluate your application. Make sure to request that your official scores are sent to the Lee Business School Evening MBA Program.

Selection Criteria

The MBA program selects individuals who have demonstrated success in their academic performance, general intellectual ability and leadership potential. For admission, we consider students who have achieved the Graduate College minimum GPA of 2.75. Admitted MBA students have an average GMAT score of 600 (range of 520-760) and an average GPA of 3.30.
